Primary School Contact

Welcome Meeting

Our Welcome Meeting is an important event in the transition calendar. We invite parents/carers and Year 6 students to meet key staff, including Year 7 Form Tutors. This is an introduction to Caldew School and our vision and values. During these unprecedented times, we are currently considering how we can run this meeting.


Transition Day

During the Transition Day, Year 6 students will have the opportunity to experience a typical school day at Caldew. They will meet Year 6 students from different primary schools, some Caldew teachers, sample lessons, have lunch and also take part in sporting activities. In addition, the students will meet their Form Tutor and will be guided around school by our students. This will provide familiar faces for the Year 6 student when they start school in September, particularly during their first week of school.

We are also currently reviewing how we can currently offer this day and will provide further details by letter.

First Day of School

On the first day of school in September, Caldew staff and students will be present at each entrance point to the school to direct and guide our new students into school. The majority of our students arrive by bus and teachers will take them to the theatre where there will be a welcome assembly. The students will then be taken to their form rooms. Full details of these arrangements will be provided.



Year 7 Tutor Evening

The Tutor Evening is an important opportunity for parents/carers and students to meet with Form Tutors to discuss how students have settled into Caldew and their academic targets. Further details will be provided in September 2020.

Year 7 Parents' Evening

At Parents' Evening, parents/carers and students will have the opportunity to meet with subject teachers to discuss how students have settled into their courses, their achievements and any improvements or changes which may enable students to make further progress. Further details will be provided in September 2020.

Growth Mindset

Caldew School teaches our students about mindset. The key aim of growth mindset is to create a love of learning but also a resilience that is essential for all accomplishments in life. This encourages our students to believe that their effort and attitude determine outcomes and encourages them to persevere. A programme of activities about growth mindset will be delivered via Form Tutors and also in assemblies.

Rewards

Caldew School's rewards system celebrates students' success and achievements. Students will earn rewards based upon a wide variety of factors such as their attitude to learning, their resilience and perseverance and also excellent attendance. Every week teachers nominate students for 'Learner of the Week', Year 7 celebrate a 'Star of the Week' and there are end of term celebration parties.



Caldew Code of Conduct

Behaviour Code

Caldew School's behaviour code includes very high expectations of students. Sanctions will apply if these expectations are not met. Full details will be provided in September.

Attendance

School attendance and punctuality are extremely important and are linked to attainment. At Caldew we celebrate excellent attendance through our rewards system and our target for every student is 100% attendance.

If however, a student is ever absent, the school's Attendance Officer should be contacted as soon as possible (and at the very latest by 9.30am) every day of absence, explaining the reason for the absence. Medical appointments should always be arranged outside the school day and family holidays should not be taken in term time.

Form Groups

You will receive a letter explaining which Form Group you will be joining. Each form consists of approximately 24 Year 7 students - together with the Form Tutor! The form group will include students from multiple primary schools and the focus of the form during the initial weeks will be to make new friends, to settle into secondary school and to make a great start to secondary education.

A Form Tutor is a teacher who the student will see at the beginning of each school day for the next five years. They will mentor the student throughout their time at Caldew School ensuring good academic progress and enjoyment of learning. The Form Tutor is the first contact if there are any queries, problems or worries and their contact details (email and telephone number) will be provided.

School Lockers

Students may choose to hire a school locker to store PE kits, school books and spare equipment. A letter will be issued during the first week of term in September giving further details.

Break and Lunchtime

Year 7 have their own dedicated social area within the school and this is where many Year 7 students initially spend their free time. However, in addition to the Year 7 area, students may instead choose to go outside, go to 'The Curve' and use a computer there, visit the Library or socialise with their friends in another area of the school. There are also a large number of lunchtime clubs available in school such as sport clubs, music and drama clubs, homework clubs and IT clubs.



At break and lunchtime, students will have the opportunity to purchase food and drinks. Students queue up outside the Dining Room which gives them the opportunity to choose something from the menu. There are many daily specials as well as a wide selection of favourites.

Extra-Curricular Activities

An opportunity to represent Caldew School in an activity or event is something to be extremely proud of. We are very proud of the successes that our students have achieved including music and drama, sporting events, Duke of Edinburgh and Young Enterprise.

Success is built upon commitment. If a student is selected to represent the school we ask that they commit to rehearsals and training after school. A full list of extra-curricular activities will be given to students in September and we encourage all to take part. It is a great opportunity to meet new friends from all year groups.

Payment for Food

If a student purchases food from the Dining Room at break or lunchtime, a 'cashless' system of payment operates. Caldew School uses a biometric system which involves taking and using the fingerprint of each student (the system takes the measurements of a fingerprint and coverts these into a template which is then stored on the system). We will ask parents/carers to complete a written consent form so that fingerprint data can be taken. Alternative arrangements will be made for students whose parents/carers choose not to give their consent. Once a student is on the system, accounts can then be topped up at the machines sited around school where a gel pad will recognise a registered student when they place their finger on it. Coins or notes can then be fed into the machine on a daily or weekly basis. This system successfully speeds up the food service during break and lunch time.

All students will also have an iPayimpact account which is an on-line payment system for the school's catering. Details of the iPayimpact account system will be provided. In addition, individual details may be accessed online via the iPayimpact system, including a record of purchases made and daily spend amounts.

Students may choose to bring their own packed lunch and this is eaten in the Dining Room too.

Mobile Phones

We recognise that mobile phones may be necessary before and after school for some of our students, but if a parent and student agree that a phone is brought to school, it must be turned off and stored in a school bag. All contact with and by students during the school day should be made via Student Services.

If a mobile phone is seen or heard during lesson time, it will be confiscated and parents/carers will be asked to collect it at the end of the school day. The school is not liable for any mobile phone that is brought into school.

Buses

There are lots of buses that leave from set points around the school at 3.15pm each day. During the first week at Caldew School, Year 7 students will leave their final lesson early and will be shown where to catch their bus and directed there for the first few days.

School transport for students who live in the catchment area is arranged by the County Council. Please contact them directly for information regarding allocation and passes on 01228 226427. The deadline for new applications for September 2020 is the end of May 2020. School transport for students who live outside the catchment area is arranged by parents/carers. Please contact the school if you require any further information.

Caldew School Libary

Caldew School Library is at the heart of the school, supporting a strong reading for pleasure culture through the provision of a wide range of popular fiction and non-fiction books, a Monday lunchtime book club, quiet reading with hot chocolate during Wednesday break time and a friendly, dedicated and professionally qualified librarian to give help and guidance. Students requiring support with their homework are welcome to come to the library at break and lunchtimes, where Mrs Bell (our librarian) and her Sixth Form helpers will be happy to provide assistance.

At the end of this book is a template for a book review "leaf". Year 6 students are asked to review a book that they read over the summer holidays, and then return the 'leaf' to Mrs Bell, our Librarian. Students can choose whether to print out and decorate one of the leaves provided, or to design their own review leaf! Each completed 'leaf' will earn an achievement point, and be displayed on the Reading Tree in the Library (see the picture below). Its branches are currently bare, and it is waiting for our new students to bring it alive! Caldew School Council

There are 12 members of Year 7 on the School Council and they have been an integral part of the group this year. Caldew School Council has over 70 members this year led by five School Council Chairs who are members of our sixth form community. There are 2 elected representatives per form group and these pupils sit on their Year Council. Year Councils meet a few times per half term and discuss a range of topics including fundraising and teaching and learning. Students are encouraged to share their views with their peers via conversations in form groups which their reps can feedback to their Year Council.

Each year group also has democratically elected year reps who sit on the Whole School Council alongside staff and a member of the school's governing body. The Whole School Council meets once per term to discuss the views of the whole student body and this is fed back to the school's senior leadership and governors.

This year the School Council have a number of avenues of focus including:

- Teaching and learning reviews
- Fundraising
- Promoting the School's values
- Promoting the anti-bullying ambassador scheme
- Engaging in the local community
- Building links with Carlisle Youth Council
- Reviewing sustainable practises at the school
- Developing student awareness of mental health

This year, Year 7 students have been involved in School Council presentations to staff and they have been a credit to the school. We look forward to welcoming new members next year.

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
